Cannot possess or keep more than three dogs unless a kennel license has been obtained.

Rate Increases for 2023:

Expect rate increases beginning January 2023 for the trash service, sewer base fee and the water base fee. The increases for the trash services are due to increased landfill costs and the water base rate is due to increases being passed on by Central Weld Conservancy Water District. They stated it came after an extensive look at their maintenance expenses for their aging distribution system as well as necessary upgrades and other costs associated with delivering water to their customers. They have stated there will be annual increases of at least 4% until 2029 based on the 2019 rate hearing but are subject to change. The sewer base fee is due to increased costs and maintenance fees. The Town Board is working diligently to keep the increases to a minimum.

Remember to contact the Police Department for suspicious activity, and concerns. The Police Department would rather take a call that turns out to be nothing over not getting a call that we need to deal with. Be on the look out for the Police Department's new uniforms.

Snow Routes: Keep in mind the snow route ordinance will be enforced. Signage is in place and we ask for your cooperation in keeping vehicles off of these routes during storms. Unfortunately, we will have to ticket or tow vehicles along the routes if they are not moved for public works crews to clear the streets.

Designated Snow Routes:

If there is an accumulation of 2" or more of non-drifted snow, vehicles parked on the following streets will be towed or ticketed;

1st Avenue – Main Street – Todd Avenue
Sunset Drive – North 1st Street – South 7th Street
100 Block of South 4th Street
200 Block of South 4th Street

Following the designated routes:
Priority Level B – Secondary Collectors

Sidewalk Snow Removal: Our ordinance requires snow to be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours from the end of a storm.

Ordinance 2020-3 states that from November 1st to April 30th, no recreational vehicle, boat, or trailer will be allowed to be parked on the street for snow removal safety.
